### Uniform and PE Kit

The school uniform colours are bottle green and scarlet red. Most items are available from high street shops. Red and white check shirts and blouses, school sweatshirts, cardigans, fleeces and T-shirts are available to order via the School Shop on the Arbor Parent Portal / App and collected from the School Office. The PTA hold sales of nearly-new uniform throughout the year.

#### **Boys' Uniform:**

- Bottle green V-neck pullover/cardigan or sweatshirt with school logo
- Red and white check shirt (not 'T' shirt or polo shirt)
- Plain grey long/short trousers
- Grey socks
- Black shoes (no trainers, boots or canvas shoes)

#### **Girls' Uniform:**

- Bottle green V-neck pullover/cardigan or sweatshirt with school logo
- Red and white check blouse (not 'T' shirt or polo shirt)
- Bottle green tunic/skirt (pleated, gathered or A-line not straight or slit)
- Plain grey long/short trousers
- Red and white check dress in summer (autumn 1)
- White socks
- Bottle green socks or tights in winter
- Black shoes (no trainers, boots or canvas shoes)

#### PE Uniform:

- Plain red t-shirt or school red t-shirt with school logo
- Black shorts
- White socks
- Trainers

(Children can wear their PE kits into school on PE days)

#### All children:

- Outdoor coat suitable for cold/wet weather (Bottle green or red waterproof/fleece lined outdoor coats with school logo are available to be ordered from the school office)
- Book bags for reading books are available from the school office
- Water bottles
- No jewellery, including stud earrings
- Wrist watches only, no SMART watches

#### Attendance

- Regular school attendance is essential or pupils to get the most out of their school experience, wellbeing and wider development.
- Research from the DfE found that pupils who performed better at the end of primary (Y6 SATs) and secondary school missed fewer days than those who didn't perform as well.
- When pupil attendance falls below 90% (equivalent of missing one day a week), the school will be in touch with families about support or referrals to improve the attendance.
- Holidays during term time are not authorised and penalty notice fines may be issued via the local authority.
- If your child is too unwell to attend school, please inform the office by 9.30am at the latest, providing details of illness.



### Prime Areas of Learning

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) framework 2023 is spilt into 2 areas: prime and specific.

#### The 3 prime areas:

- 1) Communication and language
- 2) Physical development
- 3) Personal, social and emotional development



### Specific Areas of Learning

#### The 4 specific areas:

- 1) Literacy
- 2) Maths
- 3) Understanding the world
- 4) Expressive arts and design









#### **Phonics**



- We use 'Bug Club Phonics' and support it with the 'Jolly Phonic' actions.
- 'Phonics Bug' is a fun and interactive programme to use at school and at home.
- The Jolly Phonic actions help children's learning of the sounds try to use at home.
- Concentrate on the sound not the name of the letter to begin with! E.g.
   c, I
- Games to play in the car:
  - batting words e.g. 'how many words begin with 's'?
  - I SPY with my little ...... a, g, t.



#### **Phonics**

- Children will start to learn sounds very quickly in Reception. Normally 3/4 sounds a week.
- Keywords (sight words) will also be sent home to learn alongside the Phonics Bug Club books.
- Writing encourage your child to SOUND out what they want to spell.
- We want them to have a go themselves.
- PLEASE don't say its spelt incorrectly!
- Spell words phonetically (children write down what they can hear)
- When does this change?
- Keywords are used all the time.
- Gradually children begin to recognise and write these words



### Reading

A Wet Wa

Illustroted by Elif Bolto Parks

- Demonstrate/ Model reading.
- Share reading books with them don't stop reading to them.
- Explore different types of books.
- Picture books the book doesn't have to have any words. Look at pictures in detail and discuss.
- DON'T COVER THE PICTURES!
- Reading skills: Comprehension and Prediction.
- IMPORTANT: You don't have to read the whole book in one go or read every night.
- Play games, e.g. look at different letters.
- Develop a routine!



## Reading and Writing



- Reading and Writing are interlinked.
- Reading helps sounds in writing.
- Sound Sheet We use print writing in Reception.
- Children can practise writing their own name. Just a capital letter at the start of their name.
- Lined Paper/pencil practise writing and forming letters correctly.



#### Maths





- Remember numbers are all around us.
- Can they recognise numbers to 20?
- Counting forwards and backwards.
- Counting make sure they physically move objects when counting.
- Practise writing numbers 0-20.



- Ordering numbers play what number comes next. You can do this out loud or with number cards.
- Mathseeds: it is an exciting online learning programme for your child to use at home that consolidates what we have been learning in class.



### Home Learning

Yellow Reading Diary:
 Sharing/ Reading a book – 10 mins daily.



- Yellow Phonics sound folder Phase 2 and Phase 3 sounds. (Start Autumn 2)
- Keywords (sight words)— these will be on cards and are ongoing throughout year.
- Blue keyword folder for practising spelling keywords (summer term).
- Keep Home Learning short and sweet!

### Little things to reassure you

Remember we are here to help and look after them.

- Please practise putting on coats / doing up zips / putting on gloves etc.
- On days that your child has PE, they will come into school wearing their PE kit and remain in it during the day.

 IMPORTANT: please inform us if your child is going home with somebody else at the end of the day




### Little Reminders
