MATHS MASTERCLASSES

Last term, four pupils in Year 5 attended the first of a series of Royal Institution Maths Masterclasses with other pupils from schools within the trust. The pupils learnt about magic squares and worked brilliantly as a team to decipher the patterns and formulas within the different puzzles. A magic square is a square grid of numbers where each row, column and diagonal must add up to the same number. The masterclass gave the children a chance to explore number bonds and symmetry, whilst learning about the fascinating history of these mathematical puzzles. 
