As part of their learning in Geography, Year 4 spent a merry morning touring the village, learning about the human and physical changes in the village over the last 100 years. Did you know...


- that the bakery was once owned by a man called Dick and it was known as Dickie's Doughnuts for 10 years and the ovens were fired by coal?
