YEAR 3 VISIT TO WAKEHURST PLACE

Woodpecker Class spent a fantastic day at Wakehurst on Tuesday 20th June.

First, we worked in groups to create some ephemeral art using natural materials.

Next, we focussed on the 'story of a sunflower', investigating the lifecycle of a sunflower to observe the differences. We used hand lenses to look closely and rulers to measure the length of roots and overall height. At this time, we also used powerful microscopes to look at different parts of flowering plants.



After lunch, we explored the stunning grounds, learning about different trees and plants and spotted pollinators.
