**Parent Survey Feedback**

Thank you to everyone who completed the most recent Parent Survey in the summer term. I have summarised key feedback for you and have also included a new link for [this term's Parent Survey](#).

	<b>Strongly Agree or Agree</b>
<b>My child is happy at this school</b>	100%
<b>The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved</b>	88%
<b>My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively or My child has not been bullied</b>	Strongly agree/agree – 21% Don't know – 6%  My child has not been bullied – 73%
<b>The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year</b>	100%
<b>When I have raised concerns, they have been dealt with properly</b>	79% (don't know 15%)
<b>For parents of pupils with SEND: My child has SEND and the school gives them the support to succeed</b>	36% (don't know 45%)
<b>The school has high expectations for my child</b>	91%
<b>The school lets me know how my child is doing</b>	91%
<b>There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school</b>	100%
<b>My child can take part in clubs and activities at this school</b>	94%
<b>The school supports my child's wider personal development</b>	85%
<b>I would recommend this school to another parent</b>	Yes – 94%

Feedback	What we've done...
<b>Individual children should have individual consequences for behaviour</b>	This has been actioned in our reviewed Behaviour Policy and procedures.
<b>More extra curricular sports clubs</b>	<p>We have plans to expand the sporting extra-curricular provision from January.</p> <p>If parents would like to volunteer their time to run an after-school or lunchtime club for a term, please contact the school office for an application form (all volunteers are subject to safer recruitment checks including a DBS application).</p>
<b>More outdoor learning and trips</b>	<p>We are looking at ways to increase the amount of curriculum enrichment activities the children can be involved in. This includes welcoming visitors and workshops into school as well as trips..</p> <p>We have widened our OAA offer for all year groups this year. Every class now takes part in Forest School sessions.</p>
<b>More diverse curriculum and more opportunities to celebrate diversity</b>	<p>A key priority for us as a school this year, is work around 'Equity, Diversity, Inclusion and Belonging'.</p> <p>Opportunities to further celebrate diversity are being explored by staff and curriculum reviews are taking place.</p> <p>We would welcome contribution from parents in future work around our Equality Policy. Information will be shared in future newsletters.</p>
