# A MESSAGE FROM THE CHILDREN'S COMMISSIONER

The Children's Commissioner for England, Dame Rachel de Souza, has written to schools to introduce the launch of **The Big Ambition**, a national survey of children and young people across England. The Big Ambition aims to hear from children across England on what they think is important. In the lead up to the next General Election, the Children's Commissioner wants to take children's thoughts, opinions and ideas to decision-makers, to make sure that the Government hears young people's voices on what they think needs to be done to make children's lives better in England. The Big Ambition survey link will be open until Friday 19th January.


