# Tatsfield Primary School PE and Sport Premium Strategy 2023-24


The PE and Sport Premium is an annual amount allocated to schools from central government to promote teaching and learning in PE and Sport in Primary schools. Tatsfield Primary School receives £17,770 annually for this purpose.

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money. For example, it is recommended that funding can be used to:

- hire specialist PE teachers
- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs
- run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in sports
- run sports activities with other schools

#### There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across

- I. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
- 2. the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- 3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5. increased participation in competitive sport





## Key achievements to date:

- All year groups receive two high quality curriculum lessons per week. These enable children to experience and explore a range of stimulating games (such as Quick Sticks Hockey, basketball, lacrosse, dodgeball) as well as work on fundamental movement skills.
- A wide variety of sports offered as extra-curricular clubs (such as football, netball, athletics, Tag-Rugby)
- Year 6 children trained as 'Activity Leaders' and provide support, ideas and run PhysiFun at lunchtimes and sporting events.
- Regular opportunities for children who are less active out of school to partake in PhysiFun sessions with Activity Leaders during breaks
- High standards and expectations set of PE lessons.
- Developed the use of PE Platform and support package— 'Real PE' to raise the profile of PE via staff training and twilight sessions, updated displays and fun interactive lessons this has created an enthusiastic staff and improved delivery of lessons.
- The use of in class active bursts- 'Jump Start Jonny' to get children moving, keep them focused on work and improve well being.
- Outside providers invited to demonstrate and work with the children on dance, judo, jujitsu.

## Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

- For new teaching staff to feel confident when delivering a varied PE curriculum.
- To ensure that Tatsfield School works to meet KS2 school sports Mark for 2023/24.
- To ensure that Tatsfield School works to meet at least a 2 star rating on KSI school award for 2023/24.
- To compete in more competitive sports events through Tandridge interschool competitions and regain the success in competitions pre-covid.
- To develop the use of zones at lunchtime to bring more structure and variation to their active time.
- To continue to implement use of 'activity leaders' around the school to increase children's involvement in class sport and their involvement with whole school sporting events.
- To train new Year 6 pupils in becoming a successful 'Activity Leaders'.
- To re-train staff on orienteering skills through Surrey Outdoor learning .
- To enrich the OAA curriculum (through forest school, external people in etc) and use the fantastic outdoor resources we have.
